أنشطة ترفيهية ممتعة: اختتام العام الدراسي بفعاليات محببة لدى الطلاب



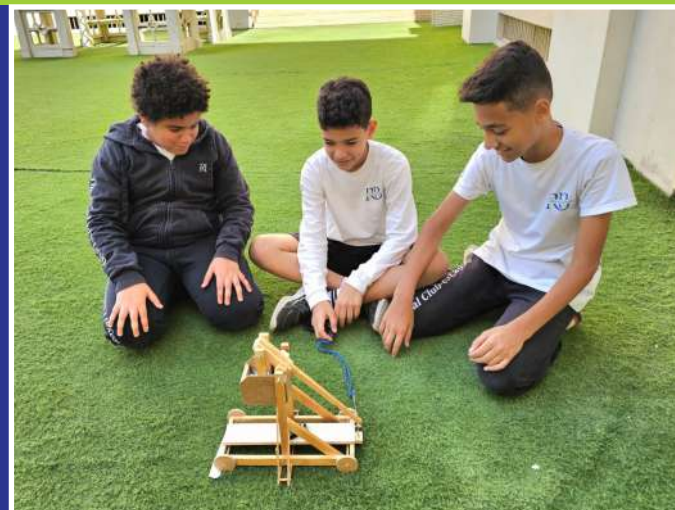
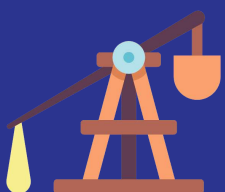

Students applied scientific method by increasing the counterweight mass by 100g every three shots, graphing the distances thrown, and drawing conclusions about the relationship between the counterweight mass and the projectile distance.
