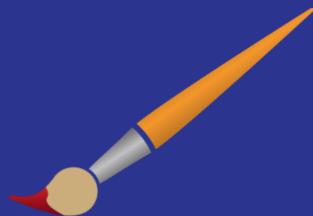


Developing Fine Motor Skills and Creativity

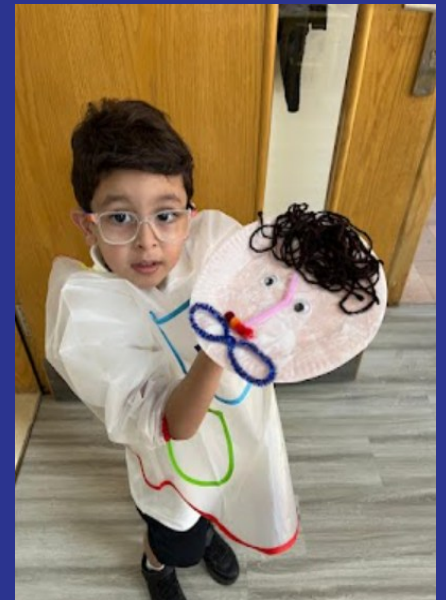
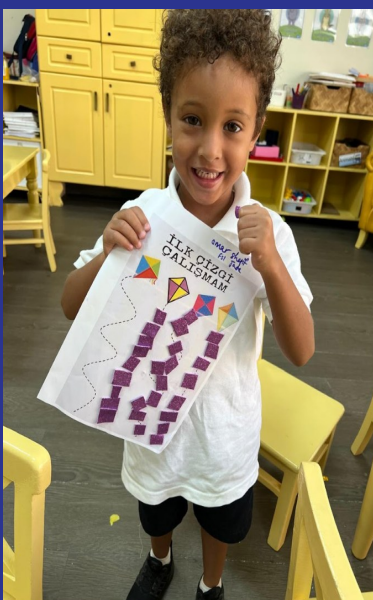
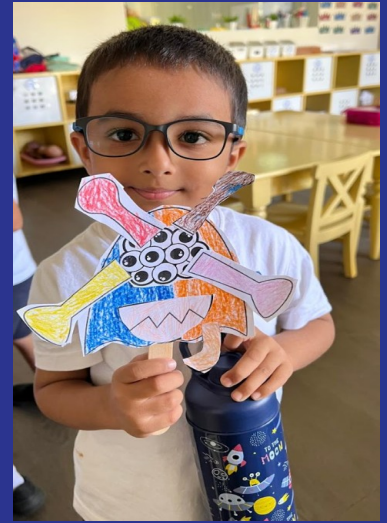
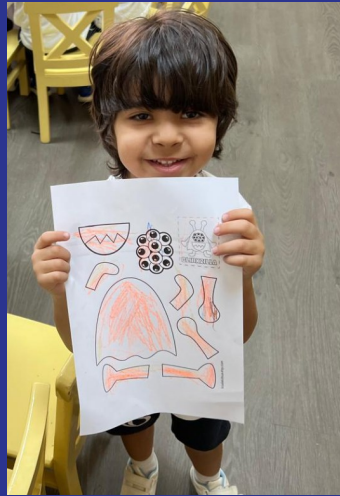
This year we introduced our specialist Art curriculum with Miss Amira Hassan in EYFS. Creative activities are an excellent medium for developing fine motor skills, along with creativity. The topic for the first part of the term was “Marvellous Marks”, where the children from Pre School to FS2 experimented with making different types of lines with different media.. This is a process-orientated experience where children are given the opportunity to explore the materials and techniques with drawing, painting cutting and sticking, using both large and small arm motor movements.



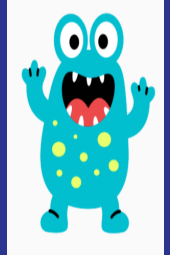

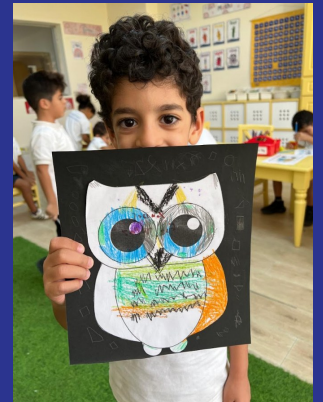
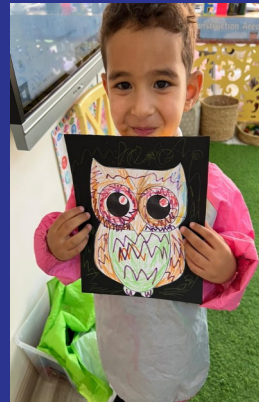
FS 1 Art Activities

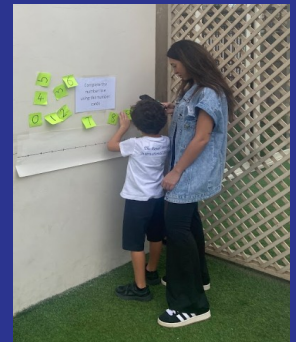


The activities covered number, pattern and shape.

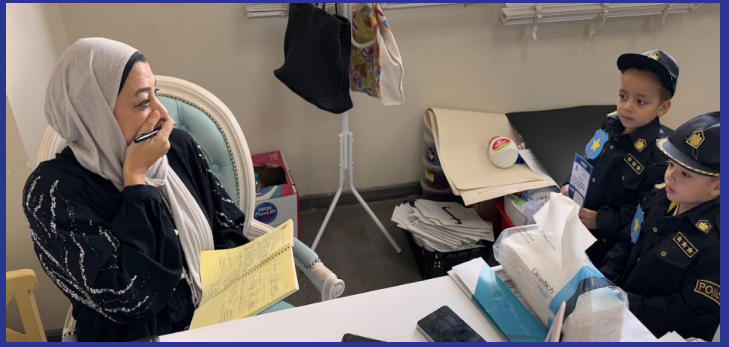


NO Pens Day
